- 1. Verify Quorum/Roll Call: Melissa Stoker took roll call prior to the start of the meeting to ensure quorum.
- 2. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Clorissti Shoemo at 10:13 am.
- 3. Public Notice: This meeting was publicly noticed for FloridaWest on June 10, 2020.
- 4. **Public Comment:** Vice Chairman Clorissti Shoemo requested public comment. Brian Wyer shared information on "Congregate Safely". The Department of Florida is handing masks out in packs of five to help encourage safe socialization. These can be mass shared as well. These masks can be washed up to 10 times and reused.

5. Action Items

- Approve February 18th, 2020 Minutes Steven Barry motioned to approve.
 Dave Hoxeng seconded.
 Passed unanimously.
- b. Approval of April 21st, 2020 Minutes Adam Principe motioned to approve. Steven Barry seconded. Passed unanimously.
- Approval of May 2020 Financials Steven Barry motioned.
 Dave Hoxeng seconded.
 Passed unanimously.
- d. BBVA

Dave Hoxeng requested board authorization to sign the BBVA paperwork. Steven Barry commented that PEDC should decline the credit card offer. Dave Hoxeng motioned to authorize certified banking and decline the credit card offer

Passed unanimously.

6. Division Reports

- **a.** Tech Park Update:
 - Invitation to Negotiate: This has been advertised per board direction. An ad has already run in the Wall Street Journal and we are exploring options in USA Today. We have received calls from at least 3-4 other states, several who saw the ad in the WSJ as well as in response to the emails we have sent out. There is a phone call scheduled for July 13th at 1 pm for anyone interested to call in and ask questions. The deadline for solicitation isn't due back until October.
 - **2.** Appraisals/Quotes for Service: We have gotten the contract for Chairman Lewis Bear to sign in order to get the appraisal done and back within 30 days or less.
- **b.** Economic Development Update:
 - 1. Business Development: Danita Andrews provided an update. Business retention visits are down. She and Jeff Dyer have been working together to stay in fairly close contact. Most are experiencing draw back. We are seeing them continue to look at their business models for opportunities to diversify their product lines. We are not seeing furloughs or layoffs. Steven Barry indicated that Ascend has indicated they are doing layoffs. Scott had a call with Ascend this morning, and according to management all of their full-time employees are still with them. Contract and leased employees are seeing layoffs. Dave Hoxeng asked where we are in getting scheduled with the new head at Ascend. Scott shared that we are waiting for them to take in person meetings again. Scott would like to see us work together regarding the use of property. Steven Barry indicated a new appraisal may be needed for a prospect looking at the Central Commerce Park. He indicated he would talk with Janice Gilley about getting the appraisal completed. Dave Hoxeng asked our commissioners to please explore opportunities to streamline the process to make it easy to acquire land/facilities for businesses.
 - 2. Workforce: Scott provided an update in Jeff's absence. The IDN network grant is beginning to wind down. As we move from strategic planning to goals/objectives, we will be expanding and reaching out to other partners for support. Some will become FloridaWest initiatives while others will transition to partners in the community. We want to ensure the population is aware of opportunities early. We will be standing up an apprenticeship program. We will be working with our business sector to get participation. Another effort is to mimic Okaloosa's effort to document separated military/service members. We aren't currently getting that data, and this effort should help us obtain this information.
 - 3. Co:Lab: We are still seeing effects of COVID in the report provided. Occupancy is down from 19 to 16. While we are down three we have already had four new tenants approved. These include Angler Up, ARGO Cyber Systems, Capacity Path (disaster recovery and relief agency), and Envision CMS (software development firm). Angler Up is already in the building. The other three are expected to move in July. Casey Campbell also referenced a proposed new Co:Lab Report, which was provided to the board.
 - **4.** Cybersecurity: Scott Luth shared that good information is coming from Craig Dalton's efforts through CITCOM. We are seeing 15-20 participants in these meetings, sharing information and brainstorming to move us forward. There is a proposed new building (Cyber Training Center) at Corry Station. We are about

5th on the list for MILCOM. We are exploring ways to educate and promote to bump up from 5th.

5. Marketing: Sena Maddison stated she is currently working on the cyber marketing plan for the next year that will focus on quality of life in our area. She will be gathering testimonials from a diverse group and will have a different campaign each month beginning in August.

6. Other Business:

- **a.** Bluffs Governor Growth Fund Application Update: Lewis Bear shared that the Governor will need to veto funds and is unsure at this time how funding for the Bluffs Growth Fund will turn out.
- Bluffs Legislative Request: Scott Luth stated that the Governor has currently rolled all the Growth Fund dollar into the General Fund. He stated funds are being distributed at the Federal level for Covid-19 and diversification. The project meets all the criteria to be funded by a \$2M EDA Grant and has County support. Steven Barry motioned to move forward with the EDA grant. Jeff Bergosh seconded. Passed unanimously.
- **c.** Space Force HQ: Lewis Bear stated the Air Force is looking for a location command HQ. Pensacola has submitted an application and is one of 150 cities that qualified, though the Governor is leaning toward an east coast location.

Next Meeting: The next PEDC Board Meeting will be on July 21st at 10:00 am.













Revenue


